Priority 2	Leadership and Management: Develop effective strategies for Governors and senior leaders to monitor and evaluate key aspects of school life. <ol style="list-style-type: none">Staff workload is monitored and evaluated.The organisation and structure of governor meetings is effective in monitoring the SIP and evaluating its impact.There is a clear structure for how, when and what subject leaders need to be monitoring and evaluating.
Priority 3	EYFS: Continue to develop the EYFS as an outstanding provision where every child reaches their full potential. <ol style="list-style-type: none">Maximise the outdoor learning opportunities.Engage with high quality research and CPD to continue to build on the outstanding practice.Ensure there is a highly effective balance between all areas of learning.
